4. First-aid measures

Inhalation

Remove to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If the affected person is not breathing, apply artificial respiration. Oxygen or artificial respiration if needed. Do not use mouth-to-mouth method if victim inhaled the substance. Induce artificial respiration with the aid of a pocket mask equipped with a one-way valve or other proper respiratory medical device. Skin contact
